Power Saving Bonus

Climate Action

Our call to install solar on available rooftops around the Albert Park Lake has been answered by the Andrews Labor Government. With \$1.6 million allocated to invest in solar we take a big step towards our net zero target whilst actively supporting our local sporting clubs within Albert Park Reserve.

By switching on the sun we can cut power bills, reduce carbon emissions, and create jobs in a renewable future for all Victorians.

Meanwhile, our local schools are embracing solar energy as a pathway to achieving carbon neutrality. As recipients of solar by way of the Greener Government School Buildings Program, Albert Park College and Albert Park Primary School are now a big step closer to joining Albert Park Preschool as certified carbon neutral.



Education Update

The Andrews Labor Government is making kinder free for three and four-year-olds, saving families up to \$2,500 per child every year at participating services, and delivering immediate relief to household budgets.

To help every child reach their full potential - we're also introducing a play-based year of learning called 'Pre-Prep', so that no child is left behind.

I congratulate the community on their hard work and commitment to the fight to retain these services.

In more education news, 11 schools in our community will share in over \$1.32 million in funding this year to make their schools more inclusive for all students.

This new funding support is ongoing and is in addition to support already provided through the current Program for Students with Disabilities.

This is the biggest change in disability support in our schools that Victoria has ever seen. It will make a difference in classrooms and to kids across Albert Park and Victoria, to ensure every student at every ability can thrive at school and in life.



Supporting Our Local Creatives

We're backing our arts organisations and giving our performers and creatives great spaces to work and perform in.

Locally, that means we will provide \$1.1 million to upgrade Theatre Works in St Kilda, so this creative hub can keep putting on the shows we love to see, all while supporting jobs for Victorians. We're also investing \$300,000 towards critical repairs to the amazing, 101-year-old, National Theatre in culturally vibrant St Kilda, one of Australia's oldest working theatres, replacing the decaying hand-pressed metal canopy.

We've also launched Victoria's biggest celebration of live music, ALWAYS LIVE. This diverse and extensive program will attract fans to travel right across the state and will deliver a massive boost to tourism and business across Victoria.

Early works on the Melbourne Arts Precinct

Transformation project started in July and are progressing well. Our \$1.7 billion investment in this project will transform

Melbourne's creative precinct — delivering more space for art and performances, improving all-abilities access and delivering a brand new public gallery, NGV Contemporary. Youth Arts Precinct

With a \$27.86 million investment by the Andrews Labor Government, this piece of industrial land at Gasworks Art Park in Albert Park is about to be transformed into a youth arts precinct.

A new state-of-the-art performance and rehearsal space will be built for students from Albert Park College and the Victorian College of the Arts Secondary School to be shared with the wider community.

We have great inner-city schools and we're investing in facilities that reflect the hard work and commitment of teachers and staff, and enable students to reach their full

Free Nursing & Midwifery Courses

The Andrews Labor Government has announced a plan to recruit and train 17,000 nurses and midwives.

This will mean anyone starting study in nursing or midwifery next year will be able to do it for free.

We'll offer full scholarships for any Victorian starting a Bachelor of Nursing or Bachelor of Midwifery, provided they take up work in a public health service once they're qualified. We're also providing scholarships for enrolled nurses to become registered nurses, and scholarships for nurses to re-enter the workforce.

Every health system in the country is under enormous pressure due to the pandemic. The best thing we can do to support our hardworking staff is give them more support on the ground.



Sick Pay Guarantee

No one should be forced to choose between a day's pay or their health, which is why the Andrews Labor Government has introduced the Sick Pay Guarantee.

Victorian casual and contract workers in hospitality, retail, supermarkets, aged and disability care, cleaning and security can now apply for 38 hours a year of sick and carer's pay.


Our Renewable Future

LGBTIQ+ Equality

We are also **hosting a massive summer street party** as part of a statewide celebration of LGBTIQ+ communities. This free celebration will feature live performances from artists and showcase LGBTIQ+ arts and culture.

In Victoria, equality is not negotiable – and we are proud to be supporting LGBTIQ+ people.
